2019 was a blur.

2020 was like no year that our generation has seen. It was described as a year that was unprecedented, trying, uncertain, bizarre, unparalleled, extraordinary, and novel. Phrases like corona-virus, COVID 19, quarantine, lockdown, flattening the curve, social and physical distancing, new-normal, essential workers, contact tracing, blursday, zoom meetings, family bubbles and many more became common place. As if that issue was not enough, in addition to the havoc that the corona virus reeked, 2020 brought Social justice issues to the forefront and political polarity became divisive. It was truly a year like no other.

I remember as the New Year began everyone talked about 2020 being the year of perspective and clarity. It began with a lot of hope, but that soon waned and shifted. March started with a dark cloud on the horizon as the news reported a potential pandemic looming. Most of us assumed it was happening in other places in the world but would never reach our shores. This type of events only happened in third-world countries. Then it arrived. In our household, we had a family gathering at Boston Pizza in Pembroke to celebrate, what would have been, Stephen's 25th birthday. Later in the week, I made an excursion to Kapuskasing to help launch the 13th station in the KFM radio network. As we drove north, the NBA postponed their season. Soon after the NHL followed suit. Soon, everything started to get canceled, including churches. Considering these events, we cancelled our Sunday morning worship service. Soon after we moved into our first lockdown. Stores closed, schools closed, churches closed, construction came to a standstill, weddings were being postponed, and there was a toilet paper shortage. Online Worship services became the norm. I as so thankful for Tyler Yanta and his expertise and skill set. He was able to assist us in making the transition to online services, almost seamlessly. As our ministry moves ahead, I think the online service will become an essential part of our ministry, even after this is all over.

Monique and I tried to use social media as effectively as we could. We began to post daily verses, devotions, worship songs, prayers, funnies, resources, and more for our Facebook Group. A daily email, that we sent out six days a week called "The Daily Encouragement" compiled many of our Facebook posts to encourage others. This is another resource that we added that I think will continue after this is completed. I also did a weekly Bible Discovery Lesson for kids which was posted on the church's webpage. It was designed for parents to do with their kids. It included a lesson, a coloring page and a word puzzle. Each week I did a small group curriculum lesson for adults as well. It was available for our homegroups and any others who wanted to dive deeper and discuss the week's Sunday message. I also put together a worship playlist for people if they wanted to have an extended worship time before the Sunday Worship premiered on our YouTube Channel.

As summer began some of the restrictions began to be lifted. We were able to have our High Power Soccer program. Wilma and Patricia did an amazing job putting it together and staying within the Health-Unit guidelines. On August 30th we began In-person services again. We were only able to run at 30 percent capacity, face masks were required, and weekly pre-registration became part of the new norm. As we moved into the fall, we were also able to reintroduce youth ministry, small groups and a Women's Bible Study. I was feeling optimistic that the potential second wave of the pandemic, that they were predicting, may not happen and then it happened. Fortunately, Nipissing-Parry Sound remained in the "Green Zone" till Christmas and we were able to have our Living Nativity. Around 280 people were able to attend this amazing event that I was very blessed to be able to be a part of. We were also able to have our annual Christmas Eve Candlelight Service.

In November, Monique resigned from her position as office administrator. She felt it was time for a change and is now supporting her husband Shannon in a position at Lewis Motors. She has served our church faithfully in this position for the last four years. I have been appreciative of all her support and will miss her immensely. THANK YOU, MONIQUE! The Church Board will have to consider hiring someone to replace her eventually. At present I am trying to manage the administrative details of the church, until such time we are ready to hire someone in this position again. (When things sort of return to normal...lol)

As we concluded 2020, we entered another lockdown as the anticipated "second wave" came into fruition. Now, as we have begun the New Year, we are in relatively the same position we were in March of the previous year. It is difficult to plan, for the future, when it is so uncertain. It is good to know that we serve an all-knowing, all-powerful, and always present God. None of this has caught Him by surprise.

In hindsight I would have maybe done some things differently. We could have restarted services earlier at 30 percent capacity or maybe done more outdoor/drive-in services during the summer. Most times we do not have the option to have a "do over'. But we can learn and grow. We were certainly need God's wisdom and direction as we face this new year.

I want to thank the congregation of Callander Bay Church for their ongoing financial support of the ministry, even during these adverse circumstances. Your faithfulness in this area has helped our monetary situation to remain stable, in the midst of these unstable days.

Thank you, as well, for the continued opportunity to serve as your Pastor. It is hard to believe that I have now served in the Near North for almost 29 years, 19 of them at Callander Bay Church. I may not know a lot, but one thing I do is that God is good. God is faithful. God is sovereign and He rewards those who diligently seek Him. Let us seek Him with all our hearts, together in 2021.

2020 started off well. I had returned from an eventful trip on a large, ocean going boat with my family. Cheryl and I were nervous to go for a number of reasons...we are not big travelers, ships and oceans don't always go well together and being couped up with 5000 other people seemed more than a little claustrophobic for our tastes. But we went, and though we would not go again, there were some bright lights discovered. My favorite was early morning, before the sun rose over the Gulf of Mexico. Warm, breezy and quiet. I found my self on the top deck with my cup of coffee. Alone but for one other man. He was a very tall, older gentleman who sat ramrod straight on his deck chair, smoking a huge cigar and just looking out at the nothingness. He and I exchange "good mornings" but nothing else was said as our path's crossed. But here is the thing, knowing he was there in an otherwise empty ship deck, brought comfort to me. Two men, engaged in the same thing, quietly enjoying the fruits of creation and taking from each other the understanding men instinctively have of each other in moments like these.

CB Fight Club, our own men's group, gather once every other week. Come March the only way you could attend is if you brought toilet paper. That was blackly humorous but suited the evolving situation. And then things got worse, "locked down" for two weeks turned into upheaval for a year. We took a break over the summer as ZOOM does not cut it, never will. We rejoined in person, briefly, in the fall until we were locked down once more. Back to ZOOM. Men obviously need more, we need to be face to face, we need to be doing something. Our hope is that we can find ways of operating that is beneficial to men and their faith as we keep meeting. Campfires, ice fishing, playing music, anything.

As iron sharpens iron, we men get deep into scripture and we discover and engage in the word. We learn from each other and support each other through conversation and prayer, and we abide by these words from Ephesians 2:20-22,
