It was just over eleven years ago that God called me to start Hope Awaits. I was still in university and didn't know anything about starting a ministry. I fought with God for months, telling Him that He had the wrong person for the job, that there must be another Nicole somewhere that He got me mixed up with. But, as always, God knows better than me. I decided to answer the call, and after finishing university in the spring of 2013 I followed God's leading in starting Hope Awaits.

As I look back all these years later I can tell you that God chose me for a reason. Not because of my abilities, but because of my lack thereof. As I had no idea what I was doing, all I could do was rely on Him. He brought along other people to help start the ministry; He provided us with our charitable status (despite me making a mistake); He provided the finances we needed to purchase a building (including an interest free loan); He provided the volunteers and supplies to renovate the facility; He provided the missionaries to work with the men that He would bring to our door; and He continues to provide! Nothing at Hope Awaits was accomplished because of who I am, it was all because of who He is!

"But He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in

hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." – 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

After serving Him at Hope Awaits for the past ten years, God has called me out. I have brought Hope Awaits as far as God wanted and allowed me to, and now He wants to bring in a new leader to carry the ministry further than I could. I will therefore be stepping down from my position as Executive Director in November 2023.

Just as I fought God when He called me to Hope Awaits, I fought Him as He has been calling me out. This decision was not easy, and I don't want to leave, but I know that I have to be obedient to what God is calling me to do.

I don't know what God has next for me, nor do I know what He has in store for Hope Awaits, but I trust in Him, knowing that He is always faithful, that His plans never fail, and that His ways are higher than my ways.

Food donations can be dropped off daily between 6pm and 9pm. Non-food donations can be dropped off in the donation bin at the side of our building.


2. Clothing Donations
