#### Pastor's Report 2023

I have now served in full time ministry in some capacity for 34 years. During that time there have been many trends and challenges. One of my favourite bloggers/podcasters is Cary Nieuwhof (which is a trend itself, when I started in ministry neither of those descriptive terms existed). In his post "10 predictions about the Future Church", he comments, "While no one's really sure of what's ahead, talking about it at least allows us to position our churches for impact in a changing world." (You can read the whole article by going to <a href="https://careynieuwhof.com/10-predictions-about-the-future-church-and-shifting-attendance-patterns/">https://careynieuwhof.com/10-predictions is "Churches that love their model more than its mission will die." He states...</a>

"When the car was invented, it quickly took over from the horse and buggy. Horse and buggy manufacturers were relegated to boutique status and many went under, but human transportation actually exploded. Suddenly average people could travel at a level they never could before.

The mission is travel. The model is a buggy, or car, or motorcycle, or jet. Churches need to stay focused on the mission (leading people into a growing relationship with Jesus) and be exceptionally innovative in our model."

It is important for us as a local church to remain focused on the mission. In this day and age, that is becoming increasingly more difficult. Which means we must be extra vigilant.

The year 2023 at Callander Bay Church was interesting. The leadership of the church was pleased that we had come through COVID, (technically, we are just in a different part of it), in a relatively good financial position. Our spending and expenses had been lower and our tithes and offerings consistent. The past year was a return to fuller in-person activities at the church, so expenses went up. Our giving's trended in the opposite direction though, and we soon began to see we were not meeting our budget. The board made some mid-course corrections, (putting some facility projects on hold), to be able to help. But we still did not meet our budget. The good news is the church has reserves to be able to cover such short falls, but if the trend continues, it will become problematic. We have tried to adjust our budget for 2024 to reflect this new reality.

I serve as ex-officio on the church board. It's a fun term meaning that I serve as a non-voting, consulting member of the board. In 2023, my role shifted, I also served as interim church board chair. I am pleased that Bonnie Reynolds has taken on the responsibility as chair. She is doing a great job.

One of the results of all that took place in the last 4 years is that some key areas in the church began to suffer some neglect. I am happy to say that these areas are being rebuilt again. Our financial team has come together, Leslie Boudreau: Treasurer, Monique Avery: Bookkeeper, Todd Attwood: Financial Accountability-Tellers and Stephanye Noll: Donations Secretary. They are doing an excellent job of managing our finances.

Our Prevention Plan team is getting us back on track in this vital area. Stacy Attwood and Bonnie Reynolds are taking the lead. Stacy has completed her training and Bonnie will complete hers soon. In 2023 the board decided to become members of Winning Kids. An organization that assists churches with training and support for our plan to protect. It is an added expense, but we need to keep this a constant value, and their expertise and resources are going to prove invaluable as we continue to minister into the future.

Our kid's ministry is starting to rebuild again as well. Thanks to all who serve in our Nursery and Jr. Church. Your ministry is so important. At present we have Nursery three weeks of the month and Jr. Church is running every week. At some point we would love to reintroduce a beginner junior church program, to serve those ages 3-5. We would love to see more people rise up and assist in this area. We need teachers, assistants, and admin/coordinators. If you are interested, please speak to me.

Last year, we began the process of putting together a facility team to oversee the proactive maintenance of our building and grounds, as well as emergency repairs of our facility. This is still a work in progress, and I am hopeful it will be more functional in 2024.

We have several small groups, prayer groups and bible studies that meet through out the week. It is extremely important that we have these smaller gatherings to encourage fellowship, friendship, accountability, deeper spiritual formation, growth, and foster a greater sense of community and mission. My hope and prayer is that each of you find a place of deeper connection within the church.

I want to express my thanks to Wilma Schweitzer and Patricia Attwood for their leadership in two of the major outreach focused events at Callander Bay Church: High Power Soccer and The Living Nativity. They did an amazing job of coordinating these events and had a very positive impact on the life of our church and our community. Just recently, Wilma and Patricia informed me that they will not be taking the lead on these events in 2024. The Board and I will be looking for God's wisdom and direction, as well as the congregation's input, as we consider the future of these events in the upcoming year. Thank you again Wilma and Patricia for all your hard work and leadership with these events!

I also would like to thank Stacy Attwood for her service as our church secretary/administrator. She has done her tasks diligently with joy and creativity. She has and continues to be a blessing and gift to our church. She has recently

decided to resign as our church custodian. Thanks for your many years of faithful and exemplary service, to clean our facility. We have begun the search for her replacement.

I had the opportunity to serve on the planning committee for the EMCC national assembly which took place in Stouffville in April. It was a good experience; I hadn't served on a denominational committee for a few years, and it was great to help in this way. I was assigned the task of being the co-host of the event along with Krista Bennett, who serves on our national leadership team. I guess having a radio voice has some benefit...lol.

As we look ahead to the New Year two thoughts enter my mind. One, is that these days are crazy. The world circumstances are out of control. The church in North America is floundering and struggling. Life is complicated and difficult. The second is that God is still faithful, good, and sovereign and He always will be. I am reminded of the words of the song Dare to Hope by Sanctus Real. In the song he talks about the difficult realities around him and then responds with this refrain:

Hope, can't be shaken by fear Can't be taken by force Lifts a soul from despair And says it's worth fighting for Our God still carries the way Of this broken world So though my sorrow is grave I'll be there to hope, Dare to hope

Let's dare to hope and trust that God can lead and guide in this time. Please pray for our leadership that we will be able to effectively plan and live out His mission in the coming year.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Pastor. Thank you as well for the freedom to serve KFM our local Christian Radio Station. It gives me the privilege of being able enhance local kingdom impact on a broader scale. Thank you for your ongoing support and encouragement, you are appreciated.

Please pray for me and my family. These last years have been difficult. Significant losses, health issues and family stresses have certainly taken its toll. There is a weariness that can come to heart and soul, which is hard to overcome. But thanks be to God, "This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God." 1 John 5:4

#### Church Board Report 2023

In 2023 the Church Board consisted of Bonnie Pannabecker, Linda Campbell, Leslie Boudreau, Tyler Yanta, Bonnie Reynolds, and Pastor John Inthof (Ex officio). In 2022 Shannon Avery had served as the board chair but as his term came to an end, no one was able to serve in this position. Pastor John stepped into this position and has been serving as interim board chair for 2023. As the year has concluded, Bonnie Reynolds has decided to serve in this position and will take on this responsibility in 2024.

We entered 2023 in a good financial position. The Board was contemplating a couple projects to improve the facility. Some of these projects we were considering included replacing the sanctuary projection computer, Auditorium renovations and the replacement of the basement floor. The first project was completed. The second was started, but it became clear that finances were going to become an issue, so it was put on hold. The third project (floors) was tabled till further notice.

We are still in a relatively good financial position, but we did go into our reserve funds. Which we all know you can't continue to do. At present we don't think it was wise to go into our reserve funds to be able to fund the projects. At present we are watching our finances closely and until we see improvement, new projects will remain on hold. Our reserves are available if needed if unplanned expenses happen.

A government grant helped us complete the change over of the basement lighting to more energy efficient bulbs. The project was completed at no additional cost to the church.

Phone and Internet issues have been a constant problem at Callander Bay Church since we purchased the building in 2001. The Bell infrastructure has been in a constant state of deterioration, with little hope of improvement, because of the movement toward a cellular system. Callander Bay Church was in a unique position of not being close enough to the town of Callander to receive services that were available in town, but not rural enough to receive services available to those in remoter areas. After much research it was decided to connect to the Starlink network. It is a moderate increase in monthly costs, but our phone and internet services have never been better. It also gives us more opportunities in the areas of live streaming, which was an impossibility with the old system.

Leslie Boudreau has been and continues to be a wonderful gift to our board. She serves as our secretary and does an amazing job. She also has recently taken on the responsibility as Treasurer. Over the last couple of years, we have had several changes in our financial leadership, and she has brought stability and helped to organize our systems. The board appreciates your help in this vital area.

We would like to say thank you to Linda Campbell and Bonnie Pannabecker for their service to our church by serving on the church board. They both served two, consecutive 3-year terms (and some bonus time) and are taking some time off from board ministry. Thanks for a job well done.

The board would also like to thank Wilma Schweitzer and Patricia Attwood for assisting the church in two of its major outreach focused projects in High Power Soccer and The Living Nativity. Both these projects were done with excellence and had great community impact. Thank you for your work.

We are looking forward to another great year of ministry at Callander Bay Church in 2024. Please pray for the leadership of our church that God would give them vision and direction and God's wisdom to be able to lead well.

# Junior Church Ministry Report 2023

This fall, we began a rotation of teaching every second week with Kenny Celeste (Patricia assisting), Natalie Money and Dale Dick. Many thanks to Natalie who offered to teach on the alternate weeks also, enabling us to have Junior Church every Sunday.

In November, Pastor John arranged the schedule so that Kenny and Dale teach once per month and Natalie twice. Regular helpers have been Kiarah Reid and Marg Loewen. There are also monitors who check on the classes every Sunday.
